CLASS DESCRIPTIONS AND DRESS CODE

Dance With Me is a 30-minute class that meets once a week for 2-3 year olds (must be 2 at time of enrollment). This class introduces young children movement through music building motor skills, coordination, and confidence. Required attire for girls is a pink leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes and for boys black shorts or tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes. Requires participation with a parent, grandparent, guardian, caregiver, etc.

<u>Creative Movement</u> is a 45-minute class that meets once a week for ages 4 & up. It develops the musicality, motor skills, rhythm, and coordination of young dancers. Required attire for girls is a pink leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes and for boys black shorts or tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes.

Ballet I is a 60-minute class that meets once a week for ages 6 & up. Beginning Ballet Technique is taught, as well as the development of coordination. Required attire is a light blue leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes for girls and black shorts or tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes for boys.

Ballet II is a 75-minute class that meets once a week for ages 8 & up. Basic Ballet Technique is taught as well as self-discipline. A second ballet class is recommended. Required attire is a lavender leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes for girls and black shorts or tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes for boys.

Ballet III is a 75-minute class for ages 10 & up. Basic Ballet Technique and the ability to take correction are the main focuses of this level. A second ballet class is highly recommended. Required attire is a red leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes for girls and black shorts or tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes for boys.

Ballet IV is a 90-minute class for ages 11 & up. Ballet Technique and the ability to take correction are the main focuses of this level. A second ballet class is strongly suggested. Pointe Technique is offered for those given permission by the faculty. The faculty will place dancers at this level. Required attire is a dark green leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes for girls and black tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes for boys.

Ballet V is a 90-minute class for ages 12 & up, High-Intermediate Ballet Technique along with the ability to dance in a group are the focuses of this level. Pointe Technique is offered for those given permission by the faculty. Three classes a week are strongly suggested. The faculty will place dancers at this level. Required attire is a black leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes for girls and black tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes for boys.

Ballet VI is a 90-minute class for ages 13 & up. Advanced Ballet Technique This level focuses on advanced level combinations mixed with artistry. Required attire is a black leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes for girls and black tights, a white fitted t-shirt, and black ballet shoes for boys.

Beg. Adult Ballet & Adult Ballet requires exercise pants and a fitted t-shirt or leotard and tights. Pink or skin tone ballet shoes for women and black ballet shoes for men.

Beginning Adult Ballet is a 60-minute class for ages 15 & up that meets weekly for sessions (Mondays 7:45-8:45). Fall Session is Sept, 9 – Nov. 11, 2024. The Spring is divided into two sessions. The 8-week Session is Jan. 13- Mar. 3, 2025 and the 6-week session is March 31 - May 5, 2025.

Adult Ballet is a 60-minute class that meets weekly for sessions (Wednesdays 8:00-9:00). Fall Session is Sept. 11 – Nov. 13, 2024. The Spring is divided into two sessions. The 8-week Session is Jan. 15 - Mar. 5, 2025, and the 6-week session is Apr. 2 - May 7, 2025. Dancers with training experience or by permission from our Artistic Staff.

<u>Pre-Pointe</u> is a 30-minute strengthening class, designed as a preparation for Pointe Technique for ages 10 & up.

Beginning, Intermediate and Advanced Pointe classes are by invitation only, and require enrollment in at least two ballet classes per week in addition to Pointe class. Required attire is the same dress as Ballet III-VI with the addition of pointe shoes. Pointe shoes must be checked by the faculty before sewing on elastic and ribbon.

All Tap classes require the same leotard and tights as your ballet class (if not enrolled in ballet a solid color leotard will be acceptable) and black tap shoes. Tap shoe elastics are strongly recommended. Black jazz pants (hemmed to the appropriate length) or shorts are optional.

Tap I is a 30-minute class that meets once a week for ages 6-8. Basic Tap Technique is taught as well as sound recognition. The faculty recommends Ballet I (or up) immediately before or after to assist in the connection between ballet and tap.

Tap II is a 45-minute class that meets once a week for ages 9-11 or is invited by the Artistic Staff. This class teaches basic Tap Technique, sound recognition, and the ability to tap in unison are the main focuses. The faculty recommends Ballet II (or up) immediately before or after to assist in the connection between ballet and tap.

<u>Tap III</u> is a 60-minute class that meets once a week for ages 12 & up. This class builds upon basic tap technique, introduces advanced tap steps, and incorporates complex rhythm and intricate footwork. Students must be invited to enroll in this class.

<u>All Jazz Classes</u> require a solid color leotard (prefer the same color as your ballet level), pink tights, and black jazz shoes. Black jazz pants (hemmed to the appropriate length) or shorts are optional.

Beginning Jazz is a 45-minute class that meets once a week for ages 8-10. Basic Jazz Technique and basic routine choreography are taught at this level. The faculty strongly recommends dancers in this level take at least one ballet class (Ballet II) in addition.

<u>Intermediate Jazz</u> is a 60-minute class that meets once a week for ages 10 & up. Jazz Technique and routine choreography are the main focuses. The faculty strongly recommends a prerequisite of at least one year of ballet class, in addition to current ballet class (Ballet III or IV) enrollment.

Advanced Jazz is a 60-minute class that meets once a week for ages 12 & up. Advanced Jazz Technique in addition to monthly routines are the main goals. The faculty strongly recommends a prerequisite of at least three years of ballet class, in addition to current ballet (Ballet V or VI) enrollment. The faculty will place dancers at this level.

<u>All Hip Hop classes</u> require appropriately fitted dance clothing that is easy to dance in and black jazz shoes or dance sneakers (sneakers must not be worn outside of the studio).

<u>Hip Hop I is a 45-minute class that meets once a week for ages 8-10.</u> Basic Hip Hop Elements are introduced. A ballet and/or jazz class is strongly recommended in addition to Hip Hop.

<u>Hip Hop II is a 60-minute class that meets once a week for ages 11 and up with previous experience.</u> Expands on the original Hip Hop Elements. A ballet and/or jazz class is strongly recommended in addition to Hip Hop.

<u>All Modern</u> requires leotard, convertible or footless tights, leggings, shorts, or jazz pants, & bare feet.

<u>Beginning Modern</u> is a 60-minute class that meets weekly for ages 10 & up. Designed to introduce a new style of movement to dancers also, the principles of contemporary movement technique will be the focus, as well as improvisational skills to strengthen their movement vocabulary. The faculty strongly suggests one year of ballet training as a prerequisite.

<u>Intermediate Modern</u> is a 60-minute class that meets weekly for ages 12 & up. Principles of contemporary movement technique will be the focus, as well as improvisational skills to strengthen their movement vocabulary. The faculty strongly suggests two years of ballet training as a prerequisite.

Advanced Modern is a 60-minute class that meets weekly for ages 14 & up. Principles of contemporary movement technique will be the focus, as well as improvisational skills to strengthen their movement vocabulary. The faculty strongly suggests two years of ballet training as a prerequisite.

<u>Drill Team Prep</u> is a 60 minute class that meets once a week for ages 11 & up. This class teaches and refines intermediate to upper level dance team technique found in the styles of kick, pom, jazz, and hip-hop. This class is designed to prepare dancers for the excitement and rigor of middle school or high school drill team tryouts. The faculty recommends 1 year of previous dance experience as a prerequisite.

The Academy is in session for nine months(4 Fall months & 5 Spring months) and all tuition is based on the total annual cost of the program. Payments may be made annually, by semester, or by month.

There is a discount for payments made annually or by semester. Discounts are not provided for absences, vacations, academy holidays or snow/ inclement weather closures.

Checks should be made payable to Western Arkansas Ballet or WAB. Monthly payments are due on the first day of the month. A \$25 late fee is charged after the 5th of the month. A student whose account is 30 days past due will be asked to observe rather than participate. RETURNED CHECK CHARGE is \$25. Enrollment in auto-pay will be required if tuition is paid after the 5th of the month for two consecutive months.

It is understood that a student who is admitted to the Academy is to be enrolled for the entire 9-month-term. If it becomes necessary for a student to withdraw, communication or written notice from an adult/guardian to the Administrator is required. If the written notification of withdrawal is submitted by the 15th of the month (without class attendance), there will be no charge for the month. Above policies are explained in your Academy Handbook.
